

Remote Learning – Information for Parents

If we have to close one or more bubbles due to Covid 19, we will work within Government Guidelines to provide communication and education whilst children remain at home.

What Parents Can Expect from School

1. A continued link between home and school so that pupils and parents can share information and work and ask questions when needed.
2. Continued help and support for parents and families from our Parent Support Adviser and other staff to ensure we continue to look after peoples' mental health and well-being
3. On-line education using Google Classrooms or Evidence Me (Yr R) as the main resource; pupils are set work by their class teacher planned from the National Curriculum. Feedback will be given on work submitted.
4. Alternative work for families not on-line or with limited access (or no access) to IT. School will school devise activities (target workbooks) to access by pick up or drop off.

More Information About Learning from Home Will Work

Staff will plan work for pupils using the current school curriculum, adapting it where necessary. We will need the support of Parents to ensure work is completed. We know that every family's circumstances are different and these will be taken into account. However, there is an expectation (in line with Government Guidelines) that children will engage with this remote learning process and work will be completed as far as is possible. Children will have individual log-ins to access the online resources they need. PLEASE KEEP THESE LOG-INS IN A SAFE PLACE. There will be a daily timetable of activities for online learning Children will be shown the online resources in school to prepare them for the possibility of using them on their own at home. Teachers will set some reading every day.

You can help your child by providing, as far as is possible, a quiet learning environment at home, preferably with a desk or table to work at. Children can follow the set timetable but will need to have a break in between each activity. They should be given the opportunity to do other activities during the day including some exercise if possible! Other activities might include:


- Gardening if you have some outdoor space

- Arts and crafts activities (junk modelling, drawing or painting).

How to access Google Classroom and Gmail

*** Please remember to keep your login details private. They should only be shared with an adult that you trust.**


1. Go to www.google.co.uk




2. Click on Gmail (highlighted on picture overleaf).
3. Enter your email address.



4. This takes you to the Norfolk Cloud Portal Login page.



5. Type in your Username and Password, then click login
You may have this message appear. Check that the email matches yours, then click on 'Continue'.



6. Once you are into your emails, you may see that you have received emails about work you have been set on Google Classroom.
To access this, click on the '9 Dots' (Google Apps) symbol in the top right hand corner of the window.



7. You will see Google Classroom  listed. Click on it.
